Message from the President by Sr. Jeanne Weber

My thanks to all who helped to make the **27th Chapter of the Monastic Congregation**, held June 10-17 at Our Lady of Grace Monastery in Beech Grove, such a resounding success. The hospitality of the sisters there was truly unsurpassed, and the chapter would not have been a success without the many individuals who organized, planned, and assisted in countless ways. Videos of the talks and panel presentations of the chapter have been sent to each prioress/administrator. These videos and the transcript of the president's address also will be uploaded to our website.

Just one of the many actions of the chapter was to change our name: We are now officially **The Monastic Congregation of St. Gertrude**. In short, this change makes our name consistent with our juridical identity (see Listen H 2), and will help to clarify our status with the Vatican. If you are interested in a deeper analysis of the reasons for this change, you may ask any of your monastery delegates to share a copy of the white paper shared with the delegations or find this on our website. This paper was written by Dan Ward with input from the three monastic congregation presidents. St. Gertrude's is the last of the "federations" to make this change, which is the result of a truly collaborative effort to educate ourselves and our monastic communities.

Speaking of changes—numerous changes were made to our Listen II norms during this chapter. These changes were necessitated by our changing demographics, new governance structures in some monasteries, changes in canon law coming from the Vatican, and changes resulting from the pandemic. Because of the number of changes, it is no longer realistic to keep the hard copies of Listen up to date and, in this digital age, it doesn't make much sense to print and bind a new hard copy. We will (as soon as it is reviewed) post the revised Listen document to our website. Anyone who wishes may print a hard copy from there.

And speaking again of changes, the following pages tell the story of a very active season of change in our monastic communities. Let us keep each other in prayer, and as summer makes its way into autumn, may nature's season of rest be mirrored in our own lives. God's blessings to all!

Forty-nine sisters age 55 and under from 23 monasteries in the U.S. and Mexico recently attended their second in a series of three annual meetings exploring the future of Benedictine life. The meeting was held July 21-23 at Immaculata Monastery in Norfolk, NE and was also attended by the presidents of our Benedictine Monastic Congregations. The theme for this meeting, which focused on collaboration, was "Companions on the Journey: Building Bridges of Hope." The meeting was facilitated by Sr. Candyce Chrystal from Sacred Heart Monastery in Yankton. Sr. Lynn McKenzie from Sacred Heart Monastery in Cullman gave the keynote address. The weekend included collaborating on two service projects during the meeting as well as breaking up into interest groups which will create project proposals to be vetted at the third meeting in this series. That meeting will be held July 5-8, 2024 at Sacred Heart Monastery in Yankton. The planning team for all three meetings consists of Sr. Maria Victoria Cutaia from Clyde, MO, Sr. Elizabeth Carillo from Atchison, KS, Sr. Raphaela Cady from Lacey, WA, Sr. Carmy Luke from Yankton, SD, and Sr. Sarah Elizabeth McMahon from Norfolk, NE. Kudos to this team for all their work on this series of meetings, which has included securing significant grant funding from LCWR.

ST. MARTIN MONASTERY. RAPID CITY

In early May we Sisters of St Martin Monastery moved across the street to take up residence in the **Good Samaritan Senior facility**. Five of our eleven members are in independent apartments, five are in assisted living and one is in nursing care. With the help of professional movers and with friendly residents to welcome us, our transition was accomplished as painlessly as possible. Good Samaritan has provided us with a large room exclusively for our use. Part of it serves as an oratory for our daily celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours; the other part of the room has bookcases, a large video screen, cupboards, a sink, and tables and chairs for various community uses. We are blessed to have Mass every Sunday and four times during the week in a Good Samaritan chapel. Retired diocesan priests who celebrated with us at the monastery now come to Good Samaritan.

We are grateful to the Sisters of Sacred Heart Monastery in Yankton who offered to share with us their **annual retreat** via Zoom, June 18-24. Sister Michaela Hedican of St. Benedict Monastery, St. Joseph, MN gave two conferences each day on the theme of hope.

In April we petitioned the President and Council of the Monastic Congregation to suspend our regular monastic governance and **appoint a "commissary."** This request was granted. Sr. Jennifer Kehrwald was appointed to continue her leadership of the community through August. At that time, Sr. Jennifer Mechtild will take up those responsibilities. Sr. Jennifer Mechtild will reside at her home monastery in Beech Grove, visiting us quarterly, or as needed. Two lay women who have been employed by the monastery will continue on as "Sisters' Services Coordinators," seeing to our day-to-day needs and acting as liaisons with Sr. Jennifer Mechtild.

The community welcomed President Sister Jeanne Weber and Sister Jennifer Mechtild for a visit July 16-18. In a ritual during Morning Prayer on July 17, **Sister Jeanne installed and blessed Sister Jennifer Mechtild**. Sister Jennifer Mechtild's appointment for a term of two years becomes effective September 1, 2023 as Sister Jennifer Kehrwald returns to her community for a much-deserved rest.








MONASTERY OF ST. GERTRUDE, COTTONWOOD


ST. BENEDICT'S MONASTERY, WINNIPEG

MOUNT ST BENEDICT MONASTERY, CROOKSTON





HOUSE OF BREAD MONASTERY, NANAIMO, BC
















We pay tribute to Sister Mary Forman, OSB, 75, prioress of the Monastery of St. Gertrude, Cottonwood, Idaho, passed into eternal life on April 20, 2023, at the monastery.

Sister Mary was born in Boise, Idaho, on September 7, 1947, to Major Neal Forman and Eugenia T. Forman. After earning a bachelor's degree from Idaho State University, she worked as a pharmacist, co-founding the Terry Reilly Clinic in Nampa, the first low-income clinic in that area. She entered the Monastery of St. Gertrude in 1973, professing her vows in 1976. She subsequently earned a master's degree in theology from St. John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota. At the University of Toronto, she earned both a master's degree and Ph.D. in medieval studies. Sister Mary's dear friend, Abbot Placid Solari, chancellor at Belmont Abbey College, North Carolina, planned to present her with an honorary doctorate during Spring, 2023.

Sr. Mary's ministries were varied and spread throughout Idaho, North Dakota, Appalachia, Toronto, and Minnesota. She served as a pharmacist, mission effectiveness educator, pastoral associate, director of religious education, and youth minister. She spent many years at St. John's University/the College of St. Benedict as a teaching assistant, adjunct professor, and visiting professor of theology. Her deep knowledge of Benedictine spirituality and life also provided opportunities for her to minister as a spiritual director, retreat and workshop facilitator, and a consultant for men's and women's monastic communities.

Sr. Mary was a board member and, for two years, president of the American Benedictine Academy. She served as associate editor of the American Benedictine Review, Magistra: A Journal of Women's Spirituality in History, and Vox Benedictina. As well as many articles on Benedictine topics, Sr. Mary wrote the book, Praying with the Desert Mothers, and edited One Heart, One Soul, Many Communities.

Sister Mary served for six years as a councilor for the Federation of St. Gertrude. She was elected prioress of the Monastery of St. Gertrude in 2015, serving a six-year term. She was reelected for a four-year term in 2021. During her tenure, an extensive renovation of the Sisters' residence was completed, as the sisters moved toward expanding the definition of the community as the Center for Benedictine Life at the Monastery of St. Gertrude.

The larger Benedictine community remembers Sr. Mary for her friendship, her extensive knowledge and willingness to share her expertise in Benedictine history and spirituality, her administrative gifts, and her prodigious note-taking ability.
